Headquartered in Washington, DC, The U.S. Army Concert Band has performed in concert venues such as Lincoln Center's Avery Fisher Hall, Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, and Hollywood Bowl. Throughout the year the ensemble participates in ongoing educational outreach and often appears at national and international music events, including the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic, the National Association for Music Education, and the American Bandmasters Association.

During the summer months, the Concert Band performs outdoor concerts on the West Steps of the U.S. Capitol and at venues throughout the Washington, DC area. Other performance opportunities include recording sessions and with chamber ensembles. The Concert Band supports international diplomacy efforts by performing in state functions and military ceremonies in the National Capital Region. The winning candidate for this audition will also be expected to perform with other large and small ensembles in "Pershing's Own."
