- Current military applicants must also include their Enlisted Records Brief or equivalent, Commander's Letter of Intent to Release, and last two NCOERs (if applicable).

- 1 One selection from Top 100 (Pop, Rock, Country, Jazz)
- ② One contemporary musical theatre selection (Post-1970)
- 3 One Aria, Art Song, or golden age musical theatre selection (Pre-1970)
- The National Anthem, unaccompanied in the key of the candidate's choice

RECORDING INSTRUCTIONS

- The U.S. Army Band will accept audio-only recordings of auditions as .wav or .mp3 files. Video submissions will not be accepted.
- Each excerpt should be recorded as an individual track. Tracks should be labeled in the order listed above using the following format: [Name]_ALTO_[Excerpt #].

Example: Alex Williams_ALTO_01 Alex Williams_ALTO_02

- Do not speak or make any identifying sounds on the recording, as it will serve as a blind preliminary audition.
- All application materials must be uploaded to the U.S. Army Band website; an upload link will be provided upon receipt of the candidate's application/résumé.
